









Weaving MST Culture Into Design

These images reflect just some of the input received through meetings with MST Nations' Community Members led by the First Nations Advisors.










Reconciliation in Action



Knowledge, stories and input shared by MST Nations' Community Members have informed the development of the ReconciliAction Whorl shown to the right. The Whorl in turn has informed the development of the two concepts we are sharing for your feedback.

The ReconciliAction Whorl has four guiding principles:

- Advancing reconciliation & planning for future generations
- Respecting the past and embracing the future
- Starting with the land, water and air
- Cultivating a sense of place

Design and Planning Inspired by Traditional Practices: The Spindle Whorl

The spindle whorl is a tool historically used by Coast Salish people to weave wool from animals such as Salish woolly dogs and mountain goats. The use of the whorl allows a tight knit weave and intricate detailed pattern designs.

In the same way, the ReconciliAction Whorl takes input we have heard from our people and weaves it into a pattern of guiding principles that will blanket this site with MST culture.










Advancing Reconciliation & Planning For Future Generations










Respecting the Past and Embracing the Future












Cultivating a Sense of Place

- Embedding public art, cultural makers, and storytelling on the land





Draft Site Plan Options



We are proud to share two draft site plan options with you. We are interested in hearing what aspects of each of these options you like, don't like, or have questions about.

The input you provide will help us arrive at a final site plan to be included in our rezoning application in 2025.

Option 1: Salmon



The Salmon Concept celebrates water stewardship and reflects the salmon's journey with boardwalks over the creek, fostering a sense of exploration and ecological discovery. Natural materials and forms create a deep connection to the land. The community gardens feature native and edible plants honoring MST traditions and the land's heritage. This approach respects the environment and embraces sustainable practices, ensuring a balanced relationship between the natural and built environments. The design aims to create vibrant green spaces that promote community engagement and enhance urban biodiversity.

Option 2: Cedar




In the Cedar Concept, water gently meanders through lush vegetation, with winding paths seamlessly guiding people from buildings to the water's edge. These pathways lead individuals through diverse landscapes, where meadows seamlessly transition into woodlands alongside the creek. The integration of natural elements fosters a deep connection to the land, acknowledging the indigenous relationship with the environment. Native plants have been incorporated, and natural materials sourced from cedar trees have been utilized.







Option 2: Cedar – Land Use Plan
